



Kimberly Hitchcock receives special recognition at the 2014 Child Support Enforcement Conference which was held on June 4, 5, and 6th, at the Belterra Casino & Resort in Florence, Indiana.

Kimberly Hitchcock is the Title IV-D Administrator in the Child Support Division within the Jasper County Prosecuting Attorney's Office. Before working at the Jasper County Prosecuting Attorney's Office, Ms. Hitchcock worked as a Deputy Clerk in the Jasper County Circuit Court. Ms. Hitchcock is responsible for overseeing the Child Support Division within the Prosecutor's Office. Prosecutor Christine Haskell is proud of the work that Ms. Hitchcock and the rest of the Child Support staff accomplish. In 2014, 82% of child support cases in Jasper County involve payment towards the child support arrearage alone, whereas the Indiana state-wide average is 69%. In June 2014, 78% of parents in Jasper County paid their full court-ordered child support obligation, compared to the Indiana state-wide average of 62%. "For the Child Support Division, these numbers are not just statistics but impressive figures showing that children in our county are being supported. It is always the goal of the Child Support Division to see these figures increase so that every child receives financial support for the necessities of life," says Prosecutor Haskell.

Ms. Hitchcock received special recognition at the 2014 Child Support Enforcement Conference on June 4, 2014, due to her dedication to children in our county. Ms. Hitchcock received the Kudos for Inspiration and Dedication (KIDS) Award at the conference held in Florence, Indiana. The KIDS Award, sponsored by the Child Support Alliance, recognizes child support workers, who continually strive to improve the quality of life for children through the collection of child support. Often these individuals are faced with a seemingly impossible task, and the barriers to collecting child support can be enormous. Individuals are nominated by their peers for the Award. Ms. Hitchcock was nominated by Ashley Clark and Ruth Swan, who are also employees of the Child Support Division.
